My personal feeling is that this job could be easily be handled by someone already employed by the county, and working in the Courthouse. I believe Marvin Rasmussen, Chairman of the Planning Commission approached you on this matter, but no action was taken.

If you wish me to continue doing this work, I would prefer to be paid on a flat monthly basis as contract labor.

For a fee of \$15.00 a month, the following work will be done:

- (1) Place necessary legal ads for both regular meetings and special hearings in the South Sioux City Star
- (2) File agenda with the County Clerk
- (3) Type minutes of regular meetings and special hearings
- (4) Send notices of meetings and hearings to Commission members, County Commissioners, County Clerk, County Attorney, County Building Inspector, SIMCO Staff, and others as instructed.

This includes mileage for one round trip from my home to the Courthouse(13 Mi. @20¢).

In the past, I have used the copier in the Clerk of District Courts office, and the county has furnished stationery and postage through the County Clerk's office. I would assume that this arrangement would continue to be satisfactory to all.

I would appreciate hearing from you if this arrangement is not suitable.

Chairman called the regular meeting to order after adjourning from the Board of Equalization's meeting.



refigure them and rebill on the same level by the same people and watch all the valuations go up
and watch the mill levy go down making everybody happy.

Chairman Rohde also thought it should be redone.

Ada Westover said that she hasn't gotten any place with her taxes and that there are many factors
which should be taken into consideration in preparing the assessed valuation of farm ground.
She complained that her notice didn't reach her untill after the deadline to appeal and she
would also like to know what the next step for her is and if it would be necessary to hire an
attorney.

Craig Broyhill said that he agreed with Smiths recommendation that Joy come with some figures on
the County Levy and when that is done he would also like to see the commercial and County of
Dakota County be redone and refigured through the whole process.

Emmett Albenesius appeared before the board protesting the valuation of his property and that
he filed form 422 and on that protest the Board of Equalization approved a decrease of \$2,000.00
on two different protest, but nothing was ever done. The County Assessor said that copies of
the forms had not reached her office by the deadline so therefore she did not make any corrections
to valuations that were protested and approved. Rod Smith suggested and directed that the County
Assessor make a certified Correction on Emmett's property deccribed in the protest.

Larry Morgan reported that he worked over the school budget and that the schools valuation
increased 9.4% and that the total asking increased 6.8% and the mill levy went down 1.5 mills.
These figures are compatable but the whole thing goes back to whether the valuations are correct.

Paul Culbertson, Bob Boals, Bud McLaughlin and Charles Beermann along with George Saunders
appeared before the Board of Commissioners concerning the elevation of the road West of Millis
Beach. Paul Culbertson requested that we don't put a culvert near the bottom of the slew.

Bud McLaughlin said he would sell the county some property for a 80' right of way. He said he
wanted market value for this property.

The Board of Commissioners directed George Saunders to draw plans for this project to determine
whether it would be agreeable to all.

George Saunders presented several bridge contracts and they were discussed.





This letter is to advise you that if you do not proceed to redistrict the county as required by law, you will be personally liable for any action which is instituted against you for your failure to comply with the law.

I would also point out to you that you could be removed from office for breach of official duty by any citizen who wishes to file suit.

I have attached hereto a copy of one of the cases decided by our Supreme Court which supports the requirement for redistricting.

House and its contents. Unanimous. Motion carried.


George Saunders appeared before the Board with proposed changes in the policies of Dakota

THE POLICY BEING:

DAKOTA COUNTY POLICY FOR GENERAL ASSISTANCE
COUNTY POOR RELIEF

Dakota County shall provide general assistance for the necessities of life to those poor persons who have a legal settlement within Dakota County, and who are unable to earn a livelihood because of any unavoidable cause.

A person shall meet the legal settlement requirement if he or she has resided one year continuously in the State of Nebraska and a minimum of six months continuously in Dakota County. Section 68-115 shall be consulted for exceptions and rules governing minors.

The determination of the classification of a person as being poor shall be made by the County Welfare Director. This determination shall be made on existing conditions including; available income, family assistance, employment status, ability to provide necessities of life eligibility for assistance by private or non-profit relief organizations. A poor person shall be eligible to receive general assistance when he or she does not have a relative to provide support. The definition of the term "relative" shall be a spouse, mother, father, son or daughter.

Persons desiring to receive General Assistance shall make written application to the County Welfare Director. Any appeal of the decision of the County Welfare Director shall be submitted to the Dakota County Welfare Board at the office of the County Clerk. The appeal shall be heard by the County Board at the next regular session.

The County Welfare Director shall, after review by the County Welfare Board of the application for General Assistance, provide the applicant written notice of approval or denial of the request.

General Assistance in an emergency may be granted by the County Welfare Director without prior authorization by the County Welfare Board except in cases involving unusual circumstances or policy considerations.

The County Board of Welfare may, at its discretion, confide the care of a poor person to a householder or householders of good moral character. Every person to whom the care of any such poor person shall be entrusted shall execute a bond to Dakota County, conditioned that he or she will treat such poor persons with humanity, and provide him or her the necessary comforts of life, fitted to his or her condition. The Bond shall state the sum to be paid by Dakota County for keeping such poor person.

The County Board of Welfare shall provide the necessary medical services for an eligible poor person. The physician and care facilities shall be authorized by the County Welfare Director prior to the receipt of treatment by the poor person. The County shall not be liable for the expense of medical treatment not authorized by the County Welfare Director.

It shall be the intent of the County Board to provide short-term emergency relief only. In granting relief to any poor person, the County Board shall take in to consideration the ability of the poor person to perform work. If such a person is strong and able-bodied, the County Board shall require, as a condition prior to the granting of relief, such person to perform any county work or labor as will fairly compensate for the relief furnished.

The County Board shall not grant General Assistance in any case should the issuance of warrants cause the county expenditures to exceed the limitations imposed by statutes.

It shall be the responsibility of the County Welfare Director to be aware of the published regulations of the State Director of Public Welfare establishing maximum payments for all health services furnished to recipients of General Assistance and to insure that the County does not exceed Those maximum payments.

The County Welfare director shall submit a monthly report to the County Board of all General Assistance Relief granted. This report shall include the current monthly expenditures and summation of expenditures for the current fiscal year. A list of these expenditures including the names of the recipients shall be published monthly as a part of the proceedings of the County Board of Commissioners.







Section 77-1502 R.R.S. 1943 Caselaw has interpreted this statute as giving the County Board jurisdiction throughout the year to equalize assessments of omitted or undervalued property. George Ewert Implement Co. v. Board of Equalization, 160 Neb. 445 7 N.W. 2d 397 (1955)

The County asked Maurice if Gloria wouldn't settle on the idea that she be paid \$10,000.00 from this time on. The Board said there was not money in his budget to pay her that amount before. Maurice said that he didn't know that it was up to her and that she was very displeased that the Board has been denighing her claim of \$800.00 and paying her \$540.00. Dan Rohde told Maurice to talk to her and find out.


Chairman Rohde opened the hearing on the proposed County Budget 7:38 P.M.

WHEREAS, The County desires to employ the Engineer to render professional engineering services and such other services as required and as hereinafter set forth in the scope of work, and

WHEREAS, the Engineer is willing to perform such work in accordance with the terms hereinafter provided and does represent that he is in compliance with the Nebraska Statutes relating to the registration of Professional Engineers, and

WHEREAS, the accomplishment of the hereinafter described work and services is authorized by law.

Now therefore, in consideration of these facts, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SCOPE OF WORK

The Engineer agrees to provide the following services for;

- A. Roadway and bridge site surveys(county to furnish land lines and ties thereto).
- B. Hydraulic analysis to include stage and discharge for the design flood, bridge backwater and bridge size recommendation and furnish same to the state for approval. This includes permit applications where required.
- C. Complete roadway plans to state standards including title sheet, summary of quantities, plan and profiles, earthwork and culvert roadway and channel cross sections.
- D. Attend plan in hand.
- E. Complete bridge or culvert design and plans to state standards.
- F. Complete R.O.W. maps, plan and tract descriptions(ownerships to be furnished by the county).
- G. Submit all plans and copies of computations to the state for review and approval.

Note: Bridge, test hole, borings are not included, if required, the Consultant will request borings from the state or will provide for borings by a private firm at actual cost to the county.

II. TIME OF COMPLETION

The Engineer agrees to complete the work within 90 days of this agreement date. This completion time or period will not be extended because of any unwarranted or avoidable delays attributed to the Engineer.

Ammendments or changes in the scope which entail a change in the number of man hours of labor by the forces of the Engineer or any unavoidable delays caused by the County or other governmental agencies which are beyond the control of the Engineer will constitute an extension in the completion time. Inclement weather will constitute an extension of time only for surveys.

III. CHANGE OF PLAN AND TERMINATION

The County reserves the right to terminate the contract for any cause, in which event compensation shall be made to the Engineer in conformity with the schedule of the component items of the total fee.

IV. FEEES AND PAYMENT

- A. In consideration for the services specified above the Engineer shall be compensated by a lump sum of \$2,740.00 payable as follows:
1. 20% upon completion of survey.
 2. 30% at time of plan in hand.
 3. 40% upon completion of structure plan.
 4. 10% upon approval of plans.

B. Payment - The County shall pay the Engineer prior to the last day of the month in which the billing was made, provided the billing is received prior to the 10th of the month.



Chairman Rohde called the meeting to order at 9:05 A.M.
The County Clerk opened the meeting with a prayer and pledge of alligiance.
Present were: Gretchen Hirschbach, Daniel Rohde, Larry Morgan, John Servine and Ted Piepho, Secretary.
Absent was: Henry DeGraaff.

Motion by Morgan, Seconded by Servine to approve the minutes of October 1st as typed and presented to the Board.
Unanimous Motion Carried.

Rod Smith appeared before the Board as an individual and property owner. He asked the Board to hear him on the subject of the land fill. He had a meeting to be at 10:00 A.M. and would like to stay for the public hearing but didn't feel he had time. He said that land fills are necessary but nobody wants one next to them. In starting a landfill it is necessary to have strict rules and controls. First of all, your proposing a change here which allows it to be any place in the agriculture zone. If its to be in the agriculture zone you want to impose some strict restrictions. I'm interested in the hills at Homer and I'm specially interested in the bluffs east of Homer where they run from Homer to the Scout Camp. Its bad to take bulldozers in and start bulldozing down trees and plugging up springs and filling in water ways with garbage destroying a lot of our natural beauty. You've just copied a lot of local environmental protection agency's rules. What you want is tailor made for Dakota County. Your changes don't say anything about the property next door unless it has a house on it. I've got places on the farm that would be a thousand feet from the area and would qualify for all of these things but yet I could have a dump there. Rod said that it wasn't just him but Margaret Packard and a couple others have called him. You inherit a lot of thing when you have a dump near. Papers, dust, rodents, etc. Commissioner Hirschbach said, " its not that they intend to set the site there and not allow any protest but that hearing and proper procedures followed when they find a site thats available. Rod said that he thought if the site was available tomorrow and that we didn't have the laws they could put the dump there. Kennard Ericksen said "that they are not allowed a dump anywhere in the county and if we have a public hearing in which there will be a public hearing when they do find a site and there be a conditional permit issued then there will be apublic hearing and all the owners in the area will be notified. Rod Smith said, " I personally think they shouldn't be allowed to interfere with water courses and you don't need to put it at the top of the hill where everybody (including Iowa) can see it. Vincent Kramper appeared before the Board. He said that he had a verbal agreement that the engineer (Orville) said they would make an access to his land off the black top road and it hasn't been done yet. It wasn't in the contractors plans but as of two weeks ago they said they would still do it. Commissioners tabled the signing of the petition, resolution with the state on accepting the black top road off the new 4 lane south of Dakota City. Chairman Rohde opened the public hearing on proposed changes in zoning regulations of Dakota County, Nebraska (Published September 27, 1979 in South Sioux _City Star) at 10:32 A.M. Attending the public hearing was:
David Lane and Vernie Larson from South Sioux City. D. R. "Duke" Smith, president of Thomas Ashford camp. Francis Lussier-Zoning Board member, Don McKinney - So. Sioux City. Julie Goodson - South Sioux City Star; Kennard Ericksen- Zoning Board Secretary.

It was proposed that the following sections be changed to read as follows:

**PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE
DAKOTA COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS**

Notice of proposed changes in the zoning regulation of Dakota County, Nebraska.

Notice is hereby given on the following proposed amendments to the text of the "Dakota County Zoning Resolution." It is proposed that these sections be changed to read as follows:

Section 500.4 2. Minimum setback and front yard: Ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every road or fifty (50) feet from the property line, whichever distance is greater.

3. Minimum setback and yard space, other yards: Ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every road or fifty (50) feet from the property line, whichever is greater.

6. Minimum lot and setback requirements for conditional uses: The minimum lot requirement and setback requirement for conditional uses will be established by the County Planning Commission during their review of the application. In no event will the minimum lot requirement be in excess of twenty (20) acres.

Section 500.5 Sanitary landfills are permitted as a special conditional use in the AG Agricultural Zone after a finding by the County Board of Commissioners that their location will not unduly hinder the enjoyment and use of nearby properties and will not disrupt the appropriate use of land and resources in the County.

In making their determination, the County Board shall consider as a minimum the following:

1. The most suitable use of the land.
2. Current and proposed uses of surrounding property.
3. Long term effects on county development.
4. Adverse effects on ground water.
5. Cost for public improvements.
6. Potential impact upon the school district and facilities.
7. Adverse effects upon the ground water.
8. Water runoff effects and potential problems.
9. Any other potential health and environmental effects and problems.

Under no condition shall a sanitary landfill be permitted within:

1. One (1,000) thousand feet of a federal aid primary or secondary highway.
2. One (1,000) thousand feet of a residential structure not owned by the property owner of the property on which the landfill is located.
3. One (1,000) thousand feet of a residential or recreational zone.
4. Ten (10,000) feet of any runway used or planned to be used by turbojet aircraft.
5. Five (5,000) thousand feet of any runway used only by piston-type aircraft.
6. The conical surfaces of an existing airport until Federal Aeronautic Administration approval has been obtained.
7. Any area determined to be unfit for development as a sanitary landfill by the Nebraska Department of Environmental Control.

Before considering the approval of a site for a sanitary landfill, the County Board shall hold a public hearing as prescribed by state law, for the purpose of hearing testimony for and against the proposed site. A recommendation from the Nebraska Department of Environmental Control shall be requested and made part of the hearing record.

The decision of the County Board of Commissioners shall be accompanied by a written finding of fact stating why said action was taken.

Section 550.3. The following uses are permitted in the AR, Agricultural-Residential Zone after a finding by the County Planning Commission that their mode of conduct and location will not hinder the enjoyment and use of nearby properties and will not disrupt the appropriate use of land and resources of the County:

1. Riding academies, dude ranches and other farm and ranch type recreational enterprises, golf courses, country clubs but not including automotive race tracks, golf driving ranges, outdoor theaters and similar commercial recreation enterprises.
2. Recreational facilities owned or operated by government or by charitable or religious organizations.
3. Churches, schools, colleges and similar facilities.
4. Facilities necessary for the provision of transportation, communication, water, sewerage, electrical energy, and natural gas pipelines and their appurtenances.

Section 550.4 2. Minimum setback and front yard: Ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every road or fifty (50) feet from the property line, whichever distance is greater.

3. Minimum setback and yard space, other yards: Ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every road or fifty (50) feet from the property line, whichever distance is greater.

5. Minimum lot and setback requirements for conditional uses: The minimum lot requirement and

setback requirement for conditional uses will be established by the County Planning Commission during their review of the application.

Section 600.4 4. Minimum front yard and setback: When land is not platted into urban type lots or when platted lots adjoin a federal or state highway or a primary county road, there shall be a minimum setback of ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every such road or highway or a minimum yard measuring fifty (50) feet from the lot line, whichever distance is greater. In the case of platted lots, these distances shall apply only to yards adjoining a federal or state highway or primary county road. Other side yards shall meet the minimum requirements for platted lots.

Section 650.3 3. Minimum setback and yards: when land is not platted into urban type lots or when platted lots adjoin a federal or state highway or a primary county road: Ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every such road or highway or a minimum yard measuring fifty (50) feet from the right-of-way or lot line, whichever distance is greater.

Section 800.4 The following uses are permitted in the HM, Heavy Manufacturing Zone after a finding by the County Planning Commission that their mode of conduct and location will not hinder the enjoyment of nearby properties and will not disrupt the appropriate use of land and resources of the County:

1. Recreational uses which are temporary in nature and do not involve any appreciable amount of fixed construction and which will not interfere with the efficient functioning of the zone for its primary purpose of providing for manufacturing and heavy commercial establishments.

Section 850.4 6. Minimum front yard and setback from public thoroughfares when the land is not platted into urban type lots or when a platted lot adjoins a state highway or primary county road: Ninety (90) feet measured from the center line of each and every such road or highway or a minimum yard measuring fifty (50) feet from the lot line, whichever distance is greater.

A public hearing will be granted any persons interested in said proposed changes or amendments at 9:30 a.m. October 9, 1979, in the basement meeting room of the Dakota County Courthouse in Dakota City, at which time written or oral statements will be considered by the Dakota County Commissioners.

Copies of these changes and of the County Zoning Resolution are on file in the County Clerk's office in Dakota City and are open to inspection during normal office hours.

October 9th Meeting Con't.

Gene Strum appeared before the Board on behalf of SIMPCO to explain the proposed changes of zoning in Dakota County. Gene said, "under no condition shall a sanitary landfill be permitted within one thousand (1000) feet of a residential structure not owned by the property owners of the property on which the landfill is located. (Item 2) the concial surfaces of an existing airport until Federal Aeronautic Administration approval has been obtained (Item 6) are not within the States guidelines.

I'd certainly be interested in comments or any recommendations how we could improve this. The State of Nebraska has supplied several comments and I feel some of them are very good. I'd like to go back and change them if thats OK with the County Board. Gene said these were just guidelines and that the Board would have to authorize a particular site later. No other proposed changes for zoning of Dakota County (other than that of the landfill) were challenged.

D. R. "Duke" Smith the executive director, secretary, registered agent of the corporation. Thomas Ashford Scout reservation, appeared before and said, "The Scout reservation this past year had about 2,500 people using that facility. Every one of those slept on the ground. If your talking about a site for a landfill for example think about in the middle of July when it doesn't rain for about 6 (six) weeks and the only source is a spring and trickle of Honey Creek. What is the distance a rat will travel to water. I think its well over a 1000 feet. We're concerned about two (2) things. One is the rodents. I'm thinking that in a dry season that the problem would be right in the middle of the Scout Reservation. Talking about the probabilities of a bird by a jet airplane I think thepossibilities of a child laying asleep at night on the ground being chewed on by a rat are much more probable the adjustment of a bird on an airplane. The other thing we're concerned about is the protection of the ground water supply. We do have a water system that they have invested a lot of money. It is a good water supply and doesn't need to be treated. I would like to conclude that you include these type of things in your decision.

Vernie Larson appeared before the Board and said "I have visited with Gene earilier and that the City of South Sioux has no objections to the ammended changes. I believe your in the same boat as we are in finding an acceptable land fill site. I think we have to accept the lesser of two evils here. Do we want a controlled land fill site that we have regulations on or do we want the people to use the County Roads. I've heard comments that this is South Sioux's problem. What happens if we run out of time on our current temporary site. We're faced with a situation of the lessor of two evils. Do we want something thats a situation of the lessor of two evils. Do we want something thats under control. Several months ago the City of South Sioux accepted to be the lead agency so there would be a responsible party involved. If we fall through on this site we are going to have to put restrictions on our compactor. We are down to one possible site.

Mary K. Harder appeared before the Board. Solid waste has destroyed my property cause I live where they dump paunch. They say the state is strict well I don't think they are. Where is this location. All the people should have a right to know where it is. My well is 22 feet down and my water is no good. I've got to get my water from town and I'm distilling water. For a long long time I haven't had a place to dump my garbage. How can we be so short sighted not to look at a menthane plant. When the envorimental agency is so strict in disposing and burning garbage but they sweep everything else under the rug and I mean paunch.

Francis Lussier appeared before the Board and said "I think Gene has done a lot of work on planning this preliminary. There may be changes that can be made in which he is going to do. I think everybody would agree that Dakota County needs a landfill.

Gene said he would like to get with the County Attorney to see where we are at right now.



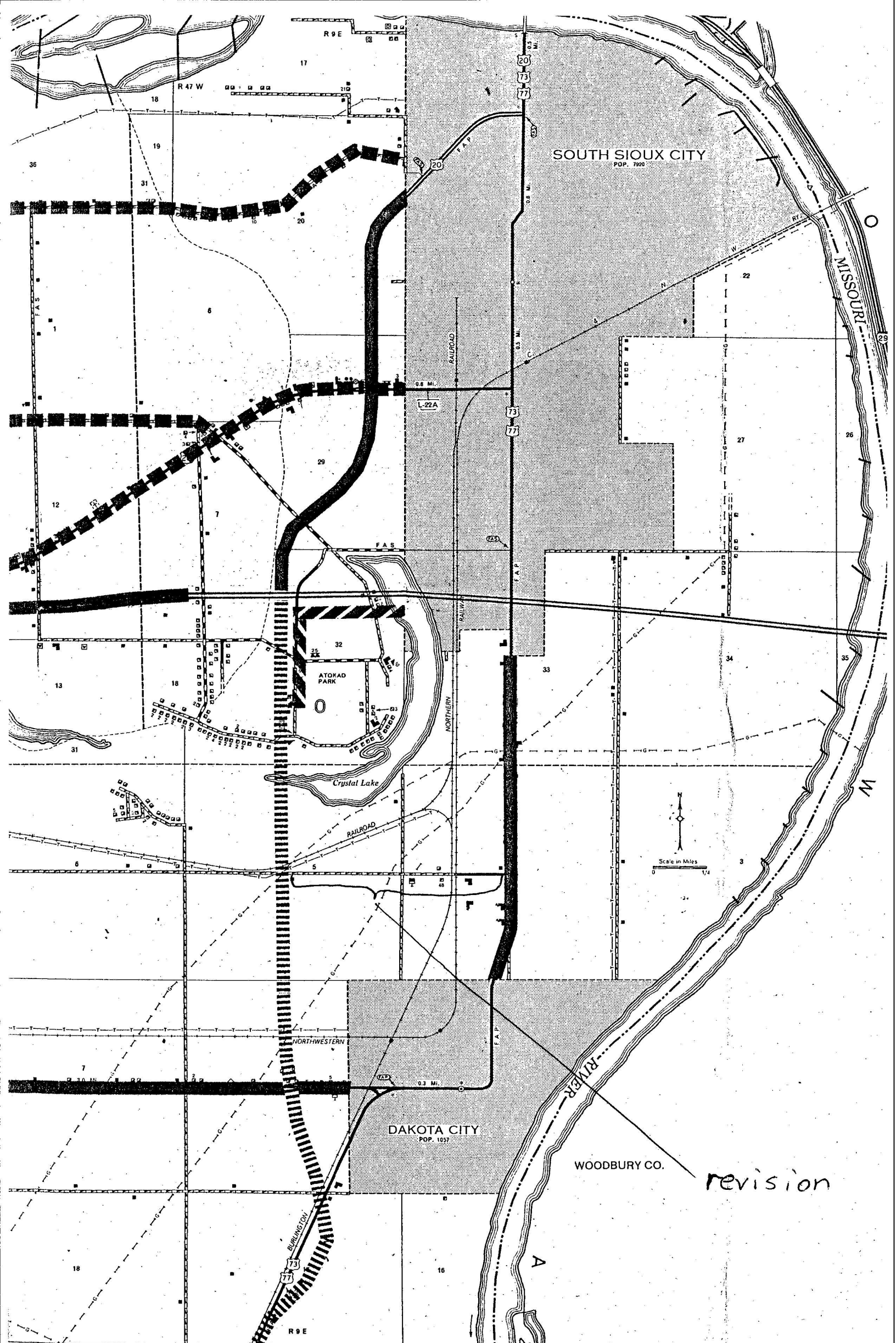

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between Dakota County, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads, hereinafter referred to as the "State",

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, certain roads in said County have been designated as being eligible for Federal funds by the Federal Highway Administration in compliance with Federal laws pertaining thereto, and

WHEREAS, Federal-aid Safety Funds have been made available by Title 23 of the United States Code, providing for pavement markings on public roads, and

WHEREAS, the Federal share payable on account of any project provided for by the funds made available under the provisions of this act shall be 100 per centum of the eligible costs thereof, and

WHEREAS, the above mentioned act provides that the Federal share of the cost of any such projects undertaken under authority of that act shall be paid only to the State, and

WHEREAS, the County desires to participate in this program and requests the State to arrange for the striping of the eligible county paved roads.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these facts, the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION 1. The County authorizes the State in behalf of the County to arrange for the striping of those paved county roads which are eligible for pavement markings under the provisions of Section 205 of the Highway Safety Act of 1973, 23 U.S.C. 151.

SECTION 2. The State agrees in behalf of the County to arrange for striping of those paved county roads which are eligible according to Section 1 above. Such striping will conform to the appropriate provisions of the 1978 Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

SECTION 3. If, within a period of two (2) years after acceptance by the State and Federal Highway Administration of this project, County maintenance activities obliterate any pavement markings placed under the authority of this agreement, the County shall, at its own expense, restore all pavement markings so obliterated to conform with the 1978 Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

If, within a period of two (2) years after acceptance by the State and Federal Highway Administration of this project, the traffic marking applied under this program are worn off by normal traffic operations so as to make such markings ineffective (as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration), such pavement markings may be restored under this program and authority of this agreement as a separate project provided funds are still available for this program.

Chairman Rohde called the meeting to order at 9:05 A.M.

The County Clerk opened with a Prayer & Pledge of Allegiance.

Present: John Servine, Larry Morgan, Daniel Rohde, Henry DeGraaff, Gretchen Hirschbach and Ted Piepho, Secretary.

Motion by Morgan, Seconded by Servine to approve the minutes of October 22, 1979 as typed.

Dick Liebschwager with Nebraska Public Power District appeared before the Board, we are attempting to provide a 115 KV line from a standing structure on the West side of the Missouri River over to the Twin Church sub station, because the line is temporary and we see a maximum life of 5 years. We would like to think we can ask the County Commissioners that we can use the 32 feet right of way on the most extensive part of this route. I'm asking what the County's feeling are on this type of proposal.

Dan Rohde--Your talking about the Twin churchs going south along the County road, then the Drainage ditch Southeast then along the County Road to Clayton Harris then the ditch again and then down to Niels.

Larry was concerned if they had permission from the private land owners for a short stretch of the road. Mr. Liebschwager said they hadn't but that they wanted to get the County's opinion first.

Motion by Morgan Seconded by Servine the County authorize the N.P.D. to submit leases with diagrams showing proposed routes for further consideration.
 Unanimous Motion Carried.

Dennis Denny appeared before the Board, He presented the bids from Jim Fleming & Son Construction and Frank Smoot for the two additional Rehab. Housed to be administered in the 78 CDBG.

Joy reported that she had a call from Richard Nut and that he was delayed out of town and couldn't make the hearing scheduled for Valley venture but that he wished to have it rescheduled Tuesday, Nov. 13, 1979.

Motion by Servine, Seconded by Morgan to approve the Building permit of Mrs. John Gotch to erect a building in Section 27, Township 28, Range 6, Emerson Precinct. Size 32 x 52 frame construction for the use of a family dwelling.
 Unanimous Motion Carried.

Dennis Donner, Elaine Frerichs appeared before the Board and explained the C.A.P.S. Program. They showed slides when explaining the program. The program consists of Co. Equipment being tied into the States computer and the cost of this would be approximately \$12,000.00 a year. The rent for the Keyboard would be \$197 a month. Basically what the program is -- a system available to the Counties that was developed by the Department of Revenue for the Counties to use for the administrative functions of their office, that is the record keeping, preparation of reports, the abstract the certificate of taxes & etc.

Chairman Rohde opened the Public Hearing Proposed Amendment to the Dakota County Zoning Regulation. This Amendment allows for the placement of Sanitary Landfills in Rural Dakota County.

Gene Sturm from the SIMPCO Staff read through the key parts of the regulations. Recently the problem of Sanitary landfill has come up. When the county realized they would be in a position to consider possible sites they asked us to develop a list of criteria that could be incorporated

into the Zoning Regulations and used to evaluate sites. What we've done to this point is prepared pages to the Zoning Regulations of Criteria to be used when the County is considering a site. That does not mean that if a site meets this Criteria that it would have to be approved nor does it mean that this would mean that this would be the only things that would be considered. These are things they would have to consider. I would like to go through and explain the main items and explain them just a little why we put them in there.

In making their determination the Board may consider pertinent information regarding the proposed site and the impact the facility will have on the county as a whole. We felt this gives them some latitude in considering things other than what was outlined.

Then we listed as a Minimum the County Board shall consider the following:

1. The need for a sanitary landfill or solid waste recycling plant.
Gene explained -- That's a very important item. If the County doesn't need one there's no use of having a hearing in the first place.
2. Use of surrounding property including current and or proposed uses.
Gene--Landfills have an impact on surrounding property. They should consider what the land is used for now and what it will be used for in the foreseeable future.
3. The cost of public improvements necessitated by the site.
Gene---This includes County roads to the site, and access to the site.
4. Long-term effects on county development.
Gene---That pretty well explains itself. It doesn't make sense to put a landfill in a place Zoned Residential.
5. Adverse effects on ground water.
Gene---This is a very Important item, in the past Landfills have polluted Ground water.
6. Drainage problems.
Gene-- Water drainage from the landfill.
7. Any specific conditions deemed necessary for approval.
Gene---This would be anything that's clearly identified in the previous Six.

Under no condition shall a sanitary landfill be permitted within:

1. Two thousand (2,000) feet of an existing residential structure, the owner of which is opposed to the site.
Gene---The County Board requested this be put in as a result.
2. One Thousand (1,000) feet of a federal iad primary or secondary highway, unless provisions for screening the site from view have been made. The County Board shall determine what constitutes adequate screening.
Gene---This is basically taken from the states requirements on Sanitary Landfill.
3. One thousand (1,000) feet of an existing residential or recreational zone or district as identified on the official county, city or village zoning map.
Gene---We are talking about identified recreational zones in Dakota County. In Dakota County's zoning jurisdiction, this provision shall apply to the Recreation Facility zone. When the site is within one thousand (1,000) feet of a city or village's zoning jurisdiction the appropriate regulation will be considered in making this determination.
4. Five thousand (5,000) feet of any runway used or planned to be used by piston type aircraft.
5. Ten Thousand (10,000) feet of any runway used or planned to be used by turbo jet aircraft.
Gene---That requirement is in the FAA Guidelines.
6. The conical surfaces of an existing airport until Federal Aeronautic Administration approval has been obtained.
Gene---Basically says that a landfill can't be located no matter what the County Board does. Before considering the approval of a site for a sanitary landfill, the County Board shall hold a public hearing as prescribed by state law, for the purpose of hearing testimony for and against the proposed site. A recommendation from the Nebraska Department of Environmental Control shall be requested and made part of the hearing record. I'd like to entertain any question anyone might have. Its important that you know that today we are jsut talking about Zoning Regulation of Dakota County and not a particular site.

Gene Sturm then turned the Hearing over to Chairman Daniel Rohde and he asked if any one had any question.

Larry Morgan said he had 2 additional statements I'd like to see in the Zoning regulation.

1. is that approval by the County Board be necessary before any refuge be taken in from outside the County.
2. The County Board shall discontinue the use of the land fill site upon presentation and substannual evidence of improper operation of such site.

John Servine said, "I think we have people here today concerned about Cemeteries and we don't have any restrictions on Cemeteries and I think this should be added."

A delegation from Jackson including representation from St. John's Cemetary tried to pinpoint the exact property being considered in that area. The landowner has asked to remain anonymous to date. They asked if regulation could prevent development of a landfill within a specified distance of a cemetary.

Gene Sturm said, "I would be interested in what restriction should be in there. There is a certain amount of latatude in as much the County Board can consider other than whats listed.

Ada Westover asked, "Has anything been considered of the Flood Plane in Dakota County?"

Duke Smith executive director of the Prairie Gold Boy Scout Council which owns and operates the Thomas Ashford camp thought perhaps there ought to be a paragraph in the regulations relative to state licensed educational and recreational youth camping areas. We are talking about a specific concern on the part of the private sector about the operational facilities where youth are involved. A camp near Lexington, Nebraska which some few years ago now received thousands of dollars just by cause of a proximity of a highway construction just because of a change in values of the County. We think it is an important consideration for our use and we're wondering what things will do in any site if we're talking about the noise of bulldozers and so on. We are concerned, realizing that toxic substances in water do not go away even through sewage and garbage do. After a period of time toxic substances are still in water. We are also interested in the paragraph relating to scavenger birds. I understand that's one problem of the operation of landfills that haven't been thoroughly solved. As a need of this exclusion for aircraft in the vicinity. If we are talking about scavenger birds in large number certainly it will have an effect on the ecology of the surrounding area, I would think. Would the consequences be any more severe than one person coming in contact?

Mrs. Lester Anderson said, "the area in which Mr. Smith was speaking is on the Honey Creek watershed and agricultural conservation purposes have closed off the lower drainage of that in connection with the Missouri River. there's no drainage to it. It drains down the Boy Scout Camp and there is no outlet for it what so ever.

Emmett Albenesius asked, "How is this going to be controlled? Are you going to have a man inspecting garbage as it comes in? It is impossible for one man to inspect the waste from inspecting that many loads at one time. He was concerned with the contamination of the under ground water supply and wondered how far in distance it would contaminate the under ground water supply.

Gretchen Hirschbach said, "As far as contaminating a water site it would not be possible to establish a landfill where that situation would occur. We are precluded from putting a landfill in any site where there is a possibility of contamination a water source.

Rod Smtih meantioned that the people ought to be more informed as to the location of the three sites, operation of the site, cost etc. Rod suggested that we should let the people know what the contract or lease is. to ask ordinary citizens to come to a meeting and then throw all the information on them. That is a little more than can be absorbed. Prior to your hearing, not only where the land is but what the lease and contract conditions are. You should have the routes to and from the site outlined and whose going to use them and how often.

Dennis Gann explained the general area where the possible site was from the St. John's Cemetery. He also informed the audience the approximate location of the other two sites. Daniel Rohde chairman of the Board then closed the hearing at 12:00 Noon.

The Board recessed at 12:15 P.M. for lunch
The Board commenced their meeting at 1:45 P.M.

Ron Brown appeared before the Board and asked for permission to purchase a 4 drawer legal size filing cabinet.

Motion by Morgan, Seconded by Hirschbach for the District probation officer to purchase the filing cabinet from Siouxland business forms.
Unanimous Motion Carried.

The Board set November 19, 1979 at the hour of 10:00 A.M. for a special meeting on the three landfill sites under consideration. The Board of Commissioners asked Maurice Redmond (County Attorney) some questions about the landfill. The two major questions were: (They also asked him for an opinion on both.

- 1) What authority does the county have to operate a landfill, whether it be joint or seperate?
- 2) What is our liability that we could occur if we would open the Hubbard site?

Maurice said that he would have to check into the law on these two questions. The Board asked him if he could have this information for them before the hearing or special meeting the 19th of November. Maurice could not guarantee this so the Board decided that they would not have the special meeting November 19th at 10:00 A.M.

Gretchen Hirschbach asked Maurice whether it would be appropriate to add the two suggestions that Larry Morgan suggested be added to the zoning regulations during the hearing.

No. 1 being that the County Commissioners have the right to close such site if not operated up to the Boards standards.

Maurice Redmond said that this was not a zoning fuction but should be a resolution passed in conjunction with your ordinances.

Larry Morgan then asked Mr. Redmond about the second that it shall be necessary for the County Board to permit refuge from outside the County. Maurice thought that should be in the operating agreement.

Maurice Redmond (County attorney) asked the Board to go into closed session for the discussion of personnel.

Motion by Morgan Seconded by Hirschbach to go into closed session to discuss personnel.

Henry DeGraaff said taht this was in his contract. Larry said that the weed Board's minutes in April reflect such but that it wasn't passed to be retroactive to January as he submitted on his claim. Williard said that he had a cow poisoned from these cans that hadn't been covered and that he had come to a meeting of the Commissioners this past spring and asked that they be covered. He requested that if the County didn't approve the claim that he would like for the County to remove the cans from the past 10 years, he added, in fact he would like to have them removed regardless of whether the County paid the claim or not. His feelings were that he didn't want to be responsible for any law suite the EPA could come up with and hold him liable in the future. He assured that he had buried these cans in three different sites and that he did dispose of them properly.

The Commissioners said that he was bonded and that he was a County Employee so felt the County would be named if that should happen. Gretchen Hirschbach asked Willard why he buried the cans after the 1976 laws became in effect if they were so stiff on the burying of the used cans. Willard said that he didn't want to and that he had gone before the County Board at that time about the situation.

Larry said that he was under the opinion that Willard did not manage the chemicals properly and that the County would stand several thousand dollars lost because of it. The cans weren't dated. Willard said that there were some 50 cans on hand with no labels on when he took the job and how do you dispose of something or use it if you don't know what it is or for. Larry added that there were over 200 cans when Willard left.

Motion by Hirschbach, Seconded by DeGraaff to denigh the claim of Willards for storage and to have a State Inspector to have someone to inspect the sites of the buried cans to relieve Mr. Criss and the County of any liability of these chemical cans being destroyed of properly.



Chairman Rohde opened the hearing to vacate the County road beginning on the line between Lots 1 & 2, Section 29, T. 29N, R. 9E, of the 6th P.M., Dakota County, Nebraska, at a point 33 feet east of the Southwest corner of said Lot 1, and thence east along the line between Lots 1 and 2 to the intersection with the County road commonly called old Highway 20.

Bruce Smith appeared before the Board on behalf of South Ridge Development asking each half of the road be given to abutting land owners. If this was the procedure of vacating this road, they would not protest but if this was not the procedure they would protest. He said South Sioux Development owns a triangular piece of ground between the road to be vacated and County Highway 20. George Saunders said that the state received a Warranty Deed from Ted Green when they purchased this in the 30's.

Orelous Bousquet said that he understands the State bought that land. He has a letter from the State stating that when the State doesn't want it anymore, it goes to the adjoining land owners. Orelous also said he felt that all of the property to County Highway 20 should be deeded to them.

Bruce Smith said, we feel the thing for the Board to consider is that South Ridge is the record title holder of the property south of that portion of the county road we're talking about vacating, and all South Ridge is saying that the south ½ of the county road be deeded to South Ridge, and the north ½ to the abutting landowner to the north. Rita Bousquet said, "the way we understand it that South Ridge doesn't own that piece of property because it was sold to the State many years ago whenever they built present Highway 20. Bruce Smith said, "there was condemnation proceedings by the State a few years back. That's why South Ridge owns it and they still do and continue that the State does not own it as the county records indicate and again what we are requesting we feel the only fair way to do it and that's what we feel the county should do. Bruce said, that we are just asking it be equally divided up and if it isn't then we would protest.

Martin Georgen asked who had the authority to vacate a road within 2 mile area of South Sioux City's limit. He said he didn't think the Commissioners did referring to a similar situation with him and others a couple of years ago. The Commissioners said it was up to them because it had been voted on and passed by both the South Sioux City Planning and Zoning and the South Sioux Council.

Mr. Stroschein asked to be notified of what decision was made upon the County Attorney's opinion. Address: Gregg Stroschein Box 220, Sgt. Bluff, Iowa

Morgan moved, Seconded by DeGraaff to advertise that Dakota County is accepting sealed bids on the material (tin) from the old county building that was torn down in Homer. Unanimous Motion Carried.

Chairman Rohde continued the hearing from December 3, 1979 on the road to be vacated beginning on the line between Lots 1 and 2, Section 29, Twn. 29N., R. 9E of the 6th P.M., Dakota County Nebraska, at a point 33 feet East of the Southwest corner of said Lot 1, and thence east along the line between Lots 1 and 2 to the intersection with the County Road commonly called old Highway 20 at 11:00 A.M.

Wayne Boyd appeared before the Board and said that the State still had Title to this property and that the County may have acquired maintenance to said property. Wayne said that if the County does own it, he would go to his Board and recommend they don't protest the vacation of said road.

Orelous Bousquet appeared before the Board and said he would take whatever he is entitled to. Rita Bousquet stated that in 1977 they understood that if this road was vacated they would acquire this property. (referring to correspondence with the State) Maurice Redmond, County Attorney, told her that's what would have happened if the County wouldn't have accepted it.

Being, there weren't any other objections to the vacation of said road, Hirschbach moved and Seconded by Morgan to close the Public Hearing on said road. Unanimous Motion Carried.

Hirschbach moved, Seconded by Servine to observe December 17th as Claims day and to pay employees before Christmas. Unanimous Motion Carried

Gretchen Hirschbach asked Maurice Redmond (County Attorney) what the County's obligation was if a Corner Section fell in the County's right of way. Maurice said there was a specific statute on that and that he would have a copy for them at the next Board meeting.

Maurice Redmond appeared before the Board to discuss the closing of the Hubbard site (Landfill). Mr. Ted Saltzman was to meet with them also, but wasn't present.


Mr. Redmond presented to the Commissioners evidence that a possible agreement existed to provide Equipment for closing the landfill. This was reflected by some notes the State and Wayne Boyd had. Larry Morgan thought the deciding factor was the State's letter, that they would then be a witness. Dan Rohde indicated that they had met at the site on at least one occasion. Gretchen asked Mr. Redmond if a conversation out in the middle of a corn field would be binding. Ms. Hirschbach said, "How are we going to have any credibility if we tell people we're going to establish a County landfill now and what if we dicide to hire a private contractor again, How are we going to have any credibility in that situation if we've been in the same situation before and didn't stand behind the agreement in that instance.






