That the undersigned have associated themselves for the purpose of incorporating under the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act and herewith adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE 1 NAME

The name of this corporation is:

NORTHEAST NEBRASKA JOINT HOUSING AUTHORITY

ARTICLE II

DURATION

The period of the corporation's duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSES

The purposes for which this corporation is organized are:

- 1. NONPROFIT. The Corporation shall be a Corporation organized and operated not for profit and shall be subject to the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act under which it is hereby incorporated.
- 2. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Corporation is to take unified action by county and/or municipal governments pursuant to Section 71-1528 R.S. Nebraska 1943 to eliminate substandard dwelling accommodations in the jurisdictional
- area of the Northeast Nebraska Joint Housing Authority. 3. NONDISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS. No part of the income of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributed to any member, commissioner or officer of the Corporation.
- 4. POWERS. In general, the Corporation shall have the power to carry on any business or activity in connection with the purpose of the Corporation and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act, subject to the limitations listed below.
- 5. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS. The Corporation shall not engage in any business transaction or enter into any formal agreements or contracts, financial or otherwise with other parties without the prior written approval of the Board of Commissioners.
- 6. CONTROL OF RESOURCES. Financial resources for implementing purposes shall be under the control and administration of the Board of Commissioners.

ARTICLE IV

PROHIBITION AGAINST SPECIFIED ACTIVITIES

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c) of the United States Internal Revenue Law (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be devoted to the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate or public office. ARTICLE V

DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS UPON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Commissioners shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all the assets of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal revenue Law), as the Board of Commissioners shall determine.

ARTICLE VI REASONABLE COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES RENDERED TO CORPORATION

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, commissioner, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to or for the Corporation in carrying out one or more of its purposes.

ARTICLE VII BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The affairs of the Corporation shall have and shall exercise all the powers of the Corporation. The number of commissioners which shall constitute the Board of Commissioners shall be such as from time to time shall be fixed by, or in the manner provided in, the By-Laws, but in no case shall the number be less than five.

ARTICLE VIII BY-LAWS

The initial By-Laws of the Corporation shall be adopted by the Board of Commissioners. Thereafter, By-Laws, unless otherwise provided under the Nebraska Nonprofit Business Corporation Act, may be adopted, amended or repealed by the Board of Commissioners at any regular or special meeting.

AVENDMENTS

These articles may be amended in the manner provided by statute at the time of amendment.

PUBLIC HEARING COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY MARCH 29, 1988 COUNTY COURT

DAKOTA COUNTY COURTHOUSE

Chairman Rohde opened the Public Hearing to amend the County Misc. General Fund Budget by \$30,000. to provide an expenditure to the Ag. Society.

Present were: Commissioner Rush, Commissioner Hirschbach, Commissioner Rohde, Ted Piepho, Secretary and Kurt Hohenstein, County Attorney.

Absent: Commissioner Huggenberger and Commissioner Stone.

Other in attendance: Lance Hedquist, John P. McNeil, Fred Stinger, Dick Ebel, Jim Cahill, Doug Garwood, Lynn Jensen, Lester Albrecht, Harold Smock, Larry Albrecht, Rick Robinette, Sam McMaster and Mary Wolf.

Chairman Rohde started the public hearing stating the purpose the public hearing was called.

Mr. Rohde, "The reason for the public hearing, This public hearing was scheduled to offer taxpayers suggestions or observations to allow the county to increase the County Misc General Fund by \$30,000. to make payment to the Ag. Society. If this expenditure were to be approved, it would be necessary to lower the cash reserve by said amount.

RULES FOR THE HEARING- The County Board would like to give everyone an opportunity to speak if they desire. A sign sheet was available at the door which you have the opportunity to indicate whether you have any questions. If you did not have an opportunity to sign before now, would you please do so at this time".

Mr. Rohde asked Mr. Lynn Jensen if he had anything to say at this time.

Mr. Jensen, "No, I don't believe so." He made mention of the fact that when they were considering the budget last fall, quite a few items were changed from one budget to another.

Mr. Rohde opened the public hearing for questions.

Lester Albrecht asked if the \$30,000. was a mandatory that must be considered or whether an amount less than that could be considered.

Mr. Fred Stinger said that was the amount they came up with that it was going to cost to host the county fair.

Larry Albrecht asked what the formula was for Thurston County's participation in that \$30,000. amount.

Mr. Jensen explained that in the past they have been paying \$7,000. and each county paid \$3,500. On the \$30,000. there has not been a change a far as Thurston County paying more than that. What we are talking about here is basically a \$23,000. increase over what we have been paying in the past. Mr. Jensen said that Thurston County did contribute monies in addition to this for expenses and premiums for the fair. It amounts to about \$11,000. Mr. John McNeil asked about the \$11,000. and Mr. Jensen said that it was received by the Ag. Society different times of the year.

Ms. Gretchen Hirschbach asked Mr. Jensen, "if the county would come up with the \$30,000 or a portion thereof, that still will not pull you out of the hole. How far is the Ag. Society in debt at this time?"

Mr. Jensen thought they were just about paid off. At the end of the fair last year they borrowed \$22,000. to pay off expenses. This had been going on for the last ten years or so. At the conclusion of the fair, they borrowed money to pay expenses of the fair and as they receive tax money they would pay off the note, further explaining their cash flow problem.

Mr. McNeil asked if the Ag. Society could legally borrow money. At that point discussion was had whether and how the Ag. Society could borrow money.

Mr. Larry Albrecht said he applauded the concept of paying rent, it's by far a better concept than the merger, the merger is by far unacceptable. Why isn't Thurston County presented with half the bill?

Mr. Stinger said that they had never had an agreement with anybody other than the Dakota County Ag. Society.

Mr. Lance Hedquist explained that he understood borrowing money. In this case it's been levied for.

Ms. Hirschbach showed concern that the Ag. Society doesn't have levying power and if they were in trouble with the higher levy, that they would be in more trouble with the lower levy. Ms. Hirschbach was concerned that we were going to pay out \$30,000. and the Ag. Society is still going to be in debt.

Mr. Jensen spoke up, "Why are all these questions coming up at this point in time, because as I stated earlier, this has been going on for the last 10 or 15 years and it has been presented on our budget each year and we have borrowed and paid off our indebtness. So my question is, Why, at this point in time, is there such controversy with that? Mr. Jensen went on to explain their budgeting process.

Mr. McNeil asked Mr. Jensen if you take the expenses against your income, does the fair make money each year?

Mr. Jensen's answer was that fairs do not make money and, no, we have never made any money. If we had we would not ask for county funds to supplement the expenses. Discussion was had by John McNeil and Lynn Jensen whether the fair made or lost money.

Mr. Larry Albrecht indicated he was of the opinion that this was a two year deal.

Mr. Stinger said you can't maintain 110 acres with all those buildings for \$30,000. a year.

Mr. Rohde, "The rent was \$7,000. before and now you're asking \$30,000. and the way the statutes read we can give the Ag. Society 38,000 or 39,000. Is there any way this figure can be reduced? Let's be a little realistic about it."

Mr. Stinger said in his opinion, no. I would not say that it's 100 percent of the majority of the board with the 30,000., but I think there are enough votes on the board that there won't be a fair at Atokad Park.

Jim Cahill spoke in favor of Atokad and made mention of the fact that we have to remember of all the functions that go on out there and I am talking about the fair business, 4H, etc. We have a lot of functions out there that they don't charge us for.

Mr. Stinger said some of that is changing. Atokad is in a position that everything that goes on out there will be required to pay some fee.

Frank Morse, County Extension Agent, informed the board of the functions they held and have scheduled to be at Atokad.

Discussion was had concerning the total budget of \$160,000.

Mr. Larry Albrecht asked if Atokad pays any real property taxes. What bugs me a little bit is everybody stands up and says, I like Atokad, and I think if its within our budgetary means, we should pay them rent. I don't agree with their figure and I don't like the attitude that you either pay this or we are going to cancel the fair. There are things that Atokad already receives from this county. I mean that they don't pay any real estate taxes. Lets don't treat them as a sacred cow, lets work out an agreement. If they turn down the figure you offer them, the worst case scenario, is we wouldn't have a fair. Another option is we may have to go to Wayne County. There are other options other than Atokad, although we all would like to see it remain open. The county can not inherit Atokad. Maybe we have to have a four county fair. We can see what Aksarben is doing. They are in the most heavily populated area of the state and they are having trouble. They have big name entertainment, nice facilities. There are only so many gambling dollars and thats where we are at. I don't care to see us get in a commitment where we are going to inherit the facility and we are going to maintain solely in Dakota County. The Tech College started off pretty reasonable and all these things start off reasonable and before we know it, they are a big factor in the budget. Lets work with them. If they don't want to work with us, lets turn away and let them do their thing. It wouldn't be a tragedy not to have a fair for one year.

Mr. Stinger made mention of the fact that Atokad paid Dakota County approximately \$24,000. in bingo tax which is hustled by volunteers which operate it 104 nights a year. The \$30,000. is not subsidizing horse racing. Horse racing makes money on its own and we have books to prove it. The money is spent to paint grand stands and barns

Harold Smock spoke in favor of Atokad and made mention that Atokad has been an asset to the community and has provided many charitable contributions to the community over the years. Dakota County has been holding the fair at Atokad since about 1956 and the majority of these years they didn't have to pay a dime. They got by for a song for years and years.

Mr. McNeil felt we needed the fair. It is a good fair and it generates alot of dollars. If I understand the funding correct, if the \$30,000. comes out of the General Fund this year, can the fair board, assuming laws change at the state level, which we have every indication that they will, use the levy for maintaining the facility. Is that right, Kurt?

Mr. Hohenstein, "The way I understand the law is what the Ag. Society received this year, essentially would stay the same, the 10,000. plus a percentage of the tax levy. The other provisions of the statute, two provisions, one when calling for additional or discretionary part, that the board may levy, that was the part that talked about capital construction. The statutory change that has been proposed would not change the discretionary language, in other words the county board would still have the right not to levy if they decided not to, but they could levy for maintenance, improvements, repairs and things like that. That's the language that is sought to be changed. I am not sure if it will or won't be changed, but I think it is still permissive. In other words, the county board either has the right to levy for that or not to levy for that. Part of the whole problem at this time, and I was at the meeting of the Ag. Society, was that there is some concern on the part of the board and myself of levying for capital construction, repairs and improvement on a facility that is not owned by the Aq. Society. Now that kind of an issue was not discussed so much this year because there was no question, but that according to the Attorney General, we couldn't levy for anything but new construction anyway; you couldn't levy for repairs, you couldn't levy for improvements, paint, those sorts of things. With the statutory, that may make it easier to do, but it's still going to be permissive by the county board, they don't have to do that if they don't want to. I think what was sought to do in this budget for the Ag Society, was to basically help maintain the facility. Now, there was some question whether they could do that and I think there still is, but that is what was intended at that time. So statutory language, as far as the tax levy, is to allow the board, if they desire and they feel it appropriate, to levy some additional monies for the actual repair or improvement other than new construction on a facility. They will have the ability to do that, whereas last year they probably did not. I think one thing Gretchen was getting at is that the board may still feel uncomfortable about levying th amount requested for Ag. Society. This is not a levy for Atokad, it's a levy for the Ag. Society and that is what my opinion essentially says. The board could not, in my opinion, give the money to Atokad. They can give it to the Ag. Society, an entity they have a right to do, but I think there is still a question as to next budget year and think that addresses a question that Gretchen asked about. What about the expenses for next year, because there is no guarantee that next year this board, or any other board will levy what was levied last year or are going to levy next year. I think it's permissive, except for one area of the statute. That's a decision each individual county board will make as that budget comes in front of them. I think that is an area, if you get through this year, that maybe the Ag. Society should work more closely with the county board on, because what happened this year was that the request was made in good faith, attempting to get what was thought to be some funds for construction, repair and improvements to the facility that they use and the county board did not feel comfortable doing that, and that can happen whether it's this board or some other board. It can happen each and every year. There are just no guarantees." He recommended they work closely with the county board and start their budget, otherwise they may be in the same situation next year.

Mr. McNeil asked what part or if all the \$37,000, is levied for the Ag. Society, or if a portion comes from the General Fund.

Gretchen Hirschbach explained the three different levies the county board has to work with.

Gretchen Hirschbach explained that the awkward situation the Ag. Society finds itself in when they stay in debt. If the county board goes in debt, we have the power to set the levy and get ourselves out of debt the next succeeding year. The Ag. Society doesn't have that power and you could find yourself in a spot where you are thousands of dollars in debt and the board says no and it would probably put you under and that is my concern about operating in that fashion.

Doug Garwood asked if they were in debt at the end of the fiscal year or at the end of the fair. Discussion followed as to whether the fair was in debt after all the taxes for that year had come in.

Mr. Sam McMaster commented that he did not think \$30,000. is very high for the kind of facility they have out there.

The board discussed applying mag water to the Atokad Road. It was felt that mag water was to expensive, but discussion developed into trying tree sap. The cost of tree sap was considerably less than mag water and was quoted at \$1950.00 per mile for the first application.

The board took a ten minute break from 2:35 p.m. until 2:45 p.m.

Kurt Hohenstein, County Attorney, Robert Giese, County Treasurer and Glenn Sedivy, Tax Collector, appeared before the board concerning Distress Warrants. At the last meeting, Glenn was down and talked to the Board about the personal property taxes and the distress warrants and what he could do from now until the new lists were made. Gretchen called me and requested that we do some research on that. We've done that and also I did some additional research on some procedures regarding the distress warrants that were returned, basically unsatisfied, unable to

The specific statutes of the State of Nebraska allow the County Board to, infact, say that the County Treasurer shall, if directed by the County Board, file suit to collect these. I guess the last list that I've got, we were unable to find property of about 75,000 dollars of uncollected personal property taxes. This was never done in the past but I think it is probably a good procedure to pursue personal property taxes in a similar manner that real estate taxes have been pursued in the county in the last 3 or 4 years, at least, where this County Board by resolution directs the County Treasurer, through the County Attorney's office, to follow procedure to institute suit, if necessary, to collect personal property taxes. I know that there are people out there that have personal property taxes due, knowing they have property that's available. The problems in the past have been locating people and then locating the particular parcel or item of property that is subject to the lien. Now that's not necessary, in other words, if the County Board says, were going to collect personal property taxes, just like we've done real estate taxes and the County Board directs the Treasurer, through my office, to collect personal property taxes by litigation, what we will do is a similar procedure that we will establish with the real estate taxes and that is to notify them by letter of whats going to happen, probably notify them by putting some kind of notice in the Star, that these taxes are going to be collected. If they do not respond within a period of time then we will institute litigation against them to collect personal property taxes. If we obtain a judgement against them, that is a lien against anything they have, personal property taxes or anything else. I am more than willing to do that, it has not been done in the past and part of the problem with being unable to collect is that those are carried over to the next year, to the next year, and personal property taxes as this board knows are no different from any other taxes, they're due knowing, they may be some what more difficult to collect then real estate taxes because they are not a lien on the property. Of course real estate doesn't leave any way, personal property has a tendency to move about, but I think it's a 75,000 dollar delinquency thats not there, and is certainly worth the effort, on the part of the Treasurers office and our office, to go after some of these people who are willfully avoiding payment of personal property taxes. I'm just telling you that Bob and I have discussed it along with Glenn and we think that this is a good first step to try to get people to understand that they have to pay these and institute action against them after a notice letter from the County Attorney's Office that we are going to collect these taxes just like real

estate taxes or any other taxes.
I drafted a resolution that is being typed right now, basically authorizing pursuant to statute, the Treasurers Office to institute action, if necessary, against these people after a notice letter and I'll answer any questions I can, but I just think it's something we ought to be doing, we haven't done it in the past, but something we ought to be doing to get these taxes collected.

Commissioner Rohde asked, "Are we going to put a dollar amount on these about 4 or 5 dollars or something like that?" Kurt: "I think that we probably should make that decision after we get the letters back. In other words, I think most of those, from experience, has been that we get an awful good response from just contacting these people and see how many of those we get back and how many of those people pay and then we'll indicate to the board what our success rate is and let them decide what they want to do. My personal feeling is that the board kind of has a duty to collect what ever it takes, wheather it is 5 or 500 dollars, cost of the collection is certainly to be assessed against the delinquent tax payer anyway. In other words, they are going to pay. But thats a decision the Board can make. Thats really a Board decision there's no mandatory language in the statutes except that the Board, if it determines to do so, shall direct the Treasurer and the Treasurer shall take action. So its really up to the Board how they want to do it.

Commissioner Rohde asked, "What about deceased, does that go on to the spouse?"

Kurt: "If the person is deceased it would probably be the obligation of the estate. There is a provision in the Nebraska Statute for filing a claim against the estate and thats something that we should be doing as a matter of course any time there is a person passed away with taxes due, we should make sure we get notice of it and then file the claim on the estate. I was surprised how much there was. I guess 75,000 dollars kind of shocked me.

Gretchen: "Well I think the board was concerned because, as we went over the list, all of us knew people who were on the list and were some what concerned that more effort wasn't being made to make sure those amounts were forth coming. Will your office have time to handle this obligation Kurt"?

Gretchen: "So you will have a resolution available?" Kurt: "Yes, its being typed and brought down. Basically all it says is that pursuant to statutes, statutes sighted directing the treasurer to take action against the delinquent distressed warrants, which have been returned unable to locate property". Gretchen: "Move then to pass the resolution prepared by the County Attorney directing the necessary action to obtain the personal property tax due and owed the county". The motion was seconded by Commissioner Huggenberger.

Chairman Rohde opened the Public Hearing on whether to change the zoning classification on the following described land from Ag. to Commercial.

Secretary Ted Piepho read the legal as follows:

Beginning at a point on the West Line of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 36 and its intersection with the North line of Highway 20; thence East along said North line of Highway 20 a distance of 650.00 feet; thence North a distance of 1000.00 feet; thence West a distance of 650.00 feet; thence South along the West line of said Northwest Quarter of the NorthWest Quarter of Section 36 a distance of 1000.00 feet to the Point of Beginning, containing 14.92 acres more or less.

Mr. James Graham, President of Farmers Coop in South Sioux City appeared before the board. The reason for the request for the rezoning was because the Farmers Coop has enlarged the last 10 years. They have put stores in Ponca and Emerson along with South Sioux City. As a result they need more space for fertilizer and they are over capacity in their present location. They looked for other sites in the county, however, one of their priorities was roads and no other site was better suited for their purpose because of Highway 20 running East and West to a cloverleaf of 77 and 110 going South. It is a disadvantage for them to go any further West because they would have to back track so much in the spring and fall, with the rush of fertilizer. The extra miles would be a burden. Mr. Graham announced that his manager, Mr. Larry Winters will make introductions of people from the fertilizer, chemical land engineering companies.

Larry Winters introduced himself as General Manager, Farmers Coop, South Sioux City. His objective was to explain their position on this relocation. He referred to a sketch drawing that was presented to the audience. He mentioned that this was a very preliminary sketch of their plans. He referred to the road and trees outside the property in question. Their tentative plans were to put a scale along the road with an office. Eventually bulk fuel in the Northwest corner, LP in the Northeast corner, chemicals and liquid solutions approximately in the middle of the property toward the north end and then their dry fertilizer along the eastern side. He brought several individuals known as experts in their field that were available for questions regarding fertilizer, chemicals and construction. Julie Bell was environmental scientist with H. Gene McKeown and Associates, Inc. consultant engineers in Denision, lowa who will be doing their preliminary construction design and Steve McWanaman and Tom Brincks with CIBA-GEIGY. Mr. Winters opened the hearing for any questions.

Ms Hirschbach asked if the regulations concerning underground tanks were regulated by the Feds.

Ms. Bell introduced herself as Julie Bell from McKeown and Associates, an engineering firm that deals with municipal engineering problems, but they also have been specializing in secondary containment designs and evironmental issues and in response to Ms. Hirschbach's question, Ms. Bell; "right now there are a set of regulations being written by the Environmental Protection Agency which is the Federal, and all state will have to comply at least with those rules. Some states such as lowa have rules on the books about underground storage tanks and lowa's are more extreme than what the Federal ones are, but everybody is kind of on hold right now to see what EPA is going to come out with."

Ms. Hirschbach asked what the design of these underground tanks would be and what kind of safe guards would be involved.

Ms. Bell said she had only gone over the plan briefly, but didn't believe they would have any underground storage tanks. She said they would be using above ground storage tanks.

Mr. Rohde asked what precautions were going to be taken from any chemicals etc. leaching into the lake.

Ms. Bell said that one of the reasons Farmers Coop retained McKeown and Associates was to come up with a design that is in compliance with the lowa Regulations on secondary containment requirements. They are written by the lowa Department of Agriculture and land stewartship which are very close to Wisconsin. Those two states have the most stringent rules on the books with reguard to containment and this type of facility. Larry wants their facility to be in conjunction with those rules to make sure the best methods are being used. She said her firm also does major studies into drainage and how a suite would impact the surrounding area and so that will also be part of the consideration they will give as they design secondary containment. Secondary containment means when you have a wash loading area, instead of just allowing to flow down the sides and run down the hills, there will be a method of making run off stays within the area and nothing from the surrounding area comes onto the pad and that anything that is collected there can be reused or disposed of in a method according to manufacturer's specifications. Secondary containment with reguard to bulk chemical or fertilizer storage mostly has to do with a earthen or concrete diking

that is put around and under the area. If it is earthen, in lows, there are certain permeability requirements so that nothing can migrate through the soil. The major contention of engineers design the facility, that if there is a spill of bulk chemical or fertilizer, the people at the facility are going to try to regain as much as possible, therefore it is not going to sit there for a long amount of time, and therefore being able to migrate through the soil

Mr. Rohde asked if this was going to be done with a cement pit.

Ms. Bell said this will be done with several different areas. The bulk chemical storage area is such that it will have concrete and will be a concrete containment area. The liquid fertilizer will most likely be an earthen berm and dry fertilizer will be in a building that has a concrete floor and concrete sidewalls.

Mr. Rohde asked about the precautions taken for cracks in the cement.

Ms. Bell stated that her engineering firm designs it so that at the stress points where it is mostly likely to crack, they incorporate water stops into the concrete itself and also require a certain amount of reinforcing steel which is a little bit above what is commonly used in concrete construction because there is a standard specification which is called water tight concrete. They can't guarantee that the concrete is not going to crack, but they treat it such that if it does crack, its not going to separate and also in the sump pit area, which is going to be exposed to water, that pit will most like be lined with a stainless liner, which will be designed so that they should not be leaking.

Ms. Hirschbach asked if it was fair to say that the commercial rules would represent a higher standard than would be

required of an ordinary farm operation.

Ms. Bell said it would.

Mr. Art Heineman spoke in favor of the facility being out there.

Mr. Harry Gray, Art teacher at South Sioux City High School and also a resident of the Lik-u-wanta beach area, was opposed to this development, particularly if there is chance for another location. He said that he was not against development, but was against the possibility of destroying natural wildlife, taking away his use of underground water systems that are available in his home and feels this is a possible threat to his life style and also that of his children. He would rather see improvement to the lake rather than to threaten the lake.

Ms. Hirschbach asked Mr. Gray if he thought that this poses any more of a threat to the underground water than the

septic tank that they all have.

Mr. Gray felt that the more that is loaded in there, the worse things can be. Just the idea of bringing in companies that have all these precautions, all these precautions tell you already that this is material that can be very detrimental to the environment. I can probably say with 100 per cent validity, that they can not guarantee an accident. If they can guarantee that there will not be an accident and that the ground water there can not be damaged, I would flag the traffic down for them, but he didn't think they could guarantee it. If he wasn't a homeowner there and didn't have to live there, he probably would not be interested. He felt that we should take a tough stand pretty soon and do what is necessary. The ground water there is so close to the lake, the lake bed is just down to the right on the North side of the road and who can guarantee the average rainfall is only going to be two inches, one and one-half inches. What happens when we get eight inches, ten inches.

Mr. Angelo Marmo said he was pretty close to the piece of ground in question and his cattle have access to the water and that there is going to be runoff which will run into the lake.

Sandy Inkster Ehrlich, Attorney representing the estate of Vern Morgan; His widow lives in a home adjacent to this property across the road. She said that she felt that the commissioners were at a disadvantage because the zoning meeting was an evening meeting and there were far more in attendance in opposition and could speak far better than her because they live out there and they talked about the environment and preserving the lake and everything that Mr. Gray stated. She said that coop had done a better job and that they have experts in the area, but I do know that they have to admit that little or no impact studies at or on the area as to whether the ground was suitable and what would happen to the runoff. Ms. Ehrlich thought that Mr. Gray and Mr. Marmo stated that there is no way that an accident may not happen in the future and since it is one of the few lakes we have, she thought Mr. Gray put it very well when he said; "we've got to act sometime, we've got to say no sometime and start protecting the environment."

Steve McManaman, a sales specialist with Cenex Land-O-Lakes, talked about nitrate leaching. Since it is already agriculturally zoned, the people that are homeowners, if they would take nitrate samples of their wells right now for a starting point, I think they could monitor the parts per million as we go along through this whole venture. One thing I do see, you do have OSHA, community right to know and a couple other organizations out there who do enforce regulations for the local coops as well as the independents, as far as monitoring their chemical and fertilizer runoffs. There are people in the industry who are monitoring each individual suite and looking over the containment systems and just monitoring each facility. People are properly trained, that if there is an accident, they know what they have to do to contain it and who to contact to control it if there is a leak. There are guidelines out there. Its not just going to be a system that happens there, if there is an accident there, that it is just not going to go unnoticed. There are stringent rules and regulations in the industry which they adhere to rather strictly. There is a \$25,000. fine if they do not report inventories.

Harry Gray asked what the process for clean up is and how many millions of dollars are we talking there or are we talking about a couple of thousand, twenty five thousand or what?

Mr. Manaman said it would depend on the type of spill.

Mr. Jim Graham said that they did try to get other suites, but the bottom down here where we need the paved roads and so forth, most of this land is owned by families for years and years and they have no desire to take any amount of money for a plot. They prefer to keep their land. We were extremely lucky that we did find a man that offered us a suite.

Thomas Brincks, Ciba-Geigy, one of the manufacturers of chemicals that supplies the cooperatives and the various dealers in this area. In listening to the discussion a couple of issues come up. One is the maintenance, to make sure that the laws are enforced and they as a company, before they will ship any product, we as reps are trained and they have to inspect the facilities and make sure they meet all state regulations, where in Nebraska right now, you can ship chemicals wherever you want to without a dike. If you put a tank in there and it's a solid tank and has a stainless lock and ball valve on, we can ship chemicals into it. Manufacturers have a more harsh approach than that. They will not ship into a facility that is not diked. Diked means there is a containment around it, that if the tank were to actually break, you have a secondary system to catch the chemicals. They, as manufacturers, are forcing industry to put more staunch regulations than they actually have. Other discussion that seems to come up a lot is run off and ground water contamination. Mr. Brincks said that in Nebraska, you can take a tanker and bring a truck load of chemicals, back the tanker up to the tank, hook up the hose and you can pump the chemicals or fertilizer. What happens is you get a good truck driver who drains the hoses and nothing touches the ground. You get a bad truck driver, some hits the ground. We get those heavy rains you're talking about and thats where you get run off.

According to lower regulations you can not do that any more. You need a loading pad. Mr. Brincks continued to diagram a loading pad and discussed the use of a loading pad. Mr. Brincks said that this would be under a roof so the amount of rain would not be an issue.

Mr. Gray brought up the issue, What happens if Coop sells this facility in three years and they are not as cautious as coop. According to Nebraska they do not have to do all what coop is doing.

Mr. Brincks said there was a committee in Nebraska working on regulations and by the time coop sold that facility, he would hope that Nebraska would have regulations in force within the state.

Some discussion was had concerning the present suite and that if they had a spillage there whether that would contaminate the underground water at Crystal Lake.

Julie Bell said she had visited the current suite and the proposed suite and the various facilities they have and just from an overall operations standpoint, relocating and taking into account everything that they are taking into account, its' going to be much better for the county as opposed to forcing them out of the county or to a suite that is not suitable. The suite they want to build on is not ideal, it is located close to the lake and close to a residential area, but there are also other things in your area that could be providing just as much or probably greater impact than what this facility is going to be doing. We are only trying to limit their liability. All with regard to you and the people living there, but with regard to their own liability and their need to keep the product that they are going to have on suite and sell it because thats their main goal. They don't want to lose it, they are not going to lose it, so first of all, they are going to consider all the things that need to be considered in that suite. Something that was discussed is what if they get more than a two inch rain fall or four inch rainfall. Before they construct on that suite, one of the issues that has to be looked into is the flood plain or the hundred year flood elevation, but there are precautions that they can take as the engineer to make sure that enough of the facility are elevated above that level so that it will be protecting more than just a couple inches more than a standard rain fall. We are considering the flood plain, we are considering the water level, we are considering the safety within the county as it was pointed out, the suite they currently have, it would be very difficult to bring that into lowa's standards without major cost to the company, trying to piece meal a little bit here and a little bit there. Therefore starting from scratch, at a new suite like this one, is a rare opportunity to do something the right way. In addition to the construction and the lay out of the facility, they have also discussed helping out with the emergency plans. As it was pointed out there are EPA regulations that require people to report to the local planning commission and have emergency plans on hand. They will make sure they have a plan that works for them as well as other local emergency response people. I will say if you are thinking of the over all well being of the county, I would consider the new suite as opposed to limiting them to the existing suite.

Chairman Rohde declared the hearing closed at 3:35 p.m. after no other comments were offered.
